Organization Description: The Alaska Public Interest Research Group's work is to advocate, educate, and research to support Alaskan communities. Broadly, AKPIRG works across four specializations: energy affordability, economic justice, good government, and language access. AKPIRG is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt nonprofit organization first incorporated in 1974.

Position Summary: The position will be focused on helping ensure Alaska's frontline communities and organizations get the most out of the myriad of federal funding opportunities available through leading AKPIRG's Energy Team and working closely with in-state partners to support their federal funding work. The role will involve research, community outreach, coalition management, and organizational management. This position is dependent on funding, with the hopes that an increase in funding will allow for additional staff/contractor support for this work.
