The Language Access Team is a department of AKPIRG that uplifts and creates opportunities for language accessibility.

Core Responsibilities:

- Assisting in the preparation, planning, and execution of an in-person Language gathering in February 2024
- Building up AKPIRG's Alaska Native Language panels.
- Coordinating travel and lodging arrangements for language panelists.
- Helping identify key informational materials, such as fact sheets and glossary terms, to be translated by language panelists
- Event planning support.
- Implementing AKPIRG's Alaska Native Language Translation Protocols.
- Working with AKPIRG communications team to share information about language events.

Qualifications:

A strong applicant will have connection to and knowledge of Alaska Native cultures and languages and experience working with Elders. Strong written and oral communication and organizational skills. Additionally, must be aligned with AKPIRG's work and values (justice, trust, accountability, and community), be able to work within dynamic teams, and be self motivated with care and attention to detail.
